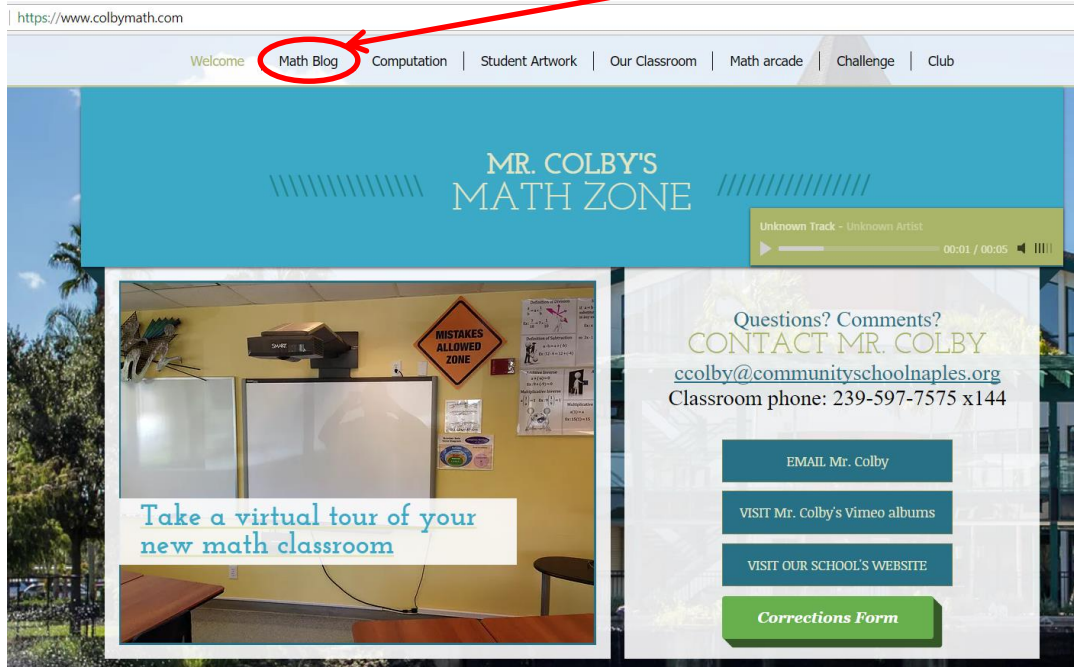


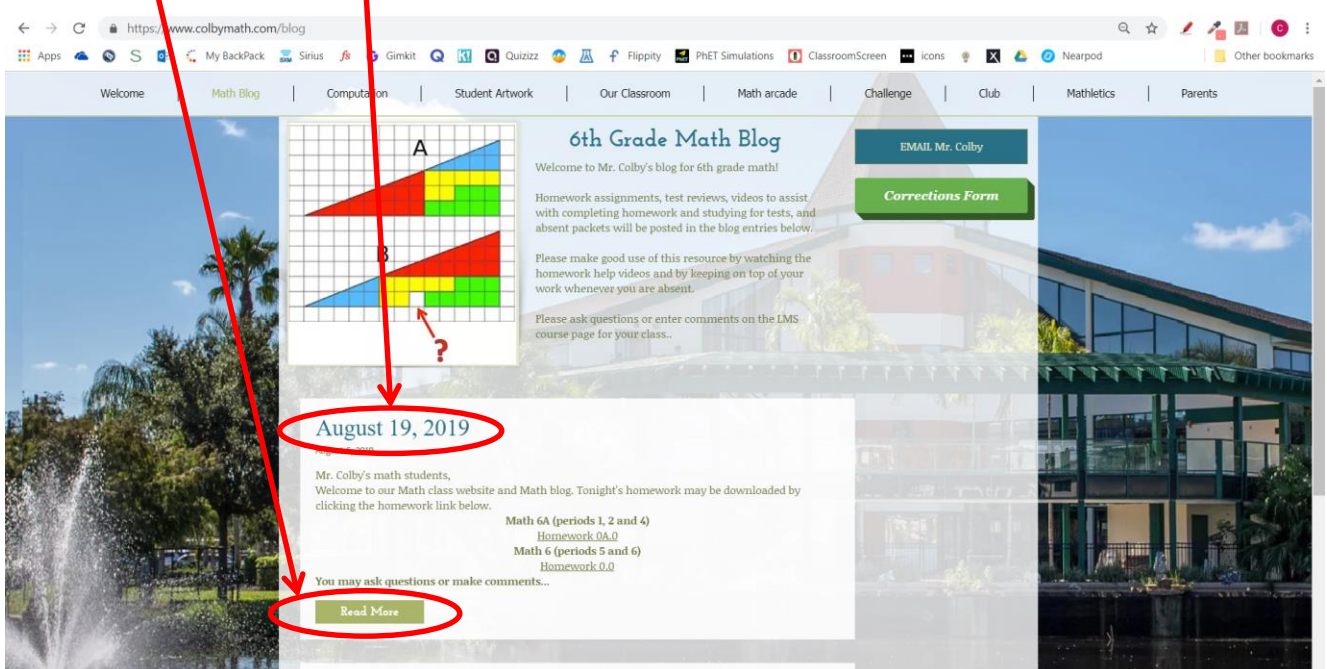
Using the Math Blog, Discussion Board, and Following Directions

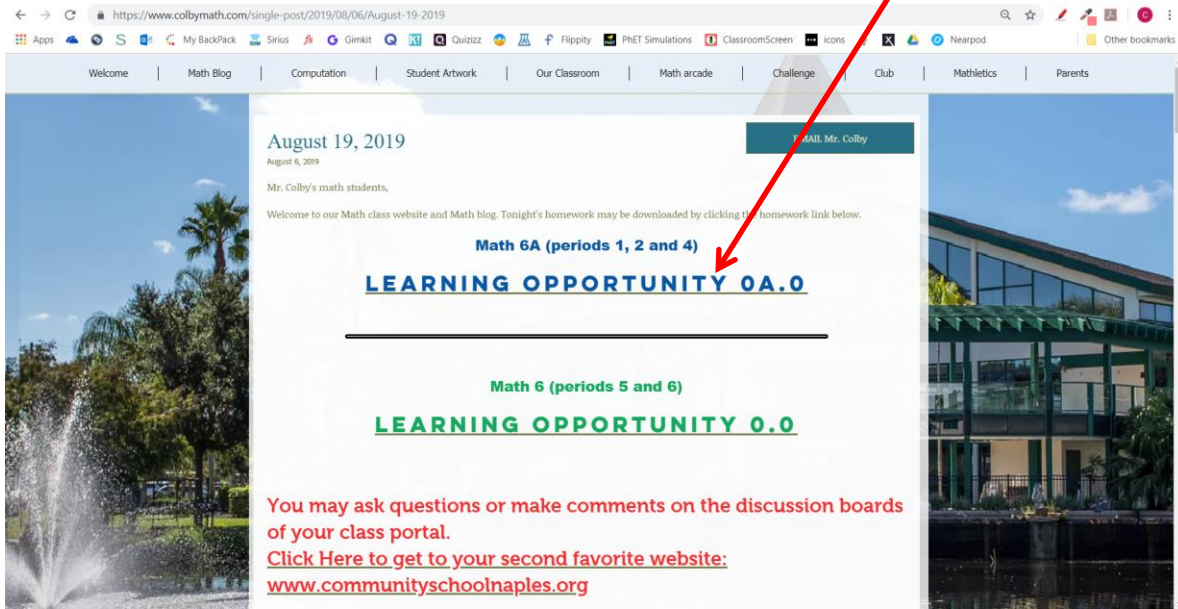

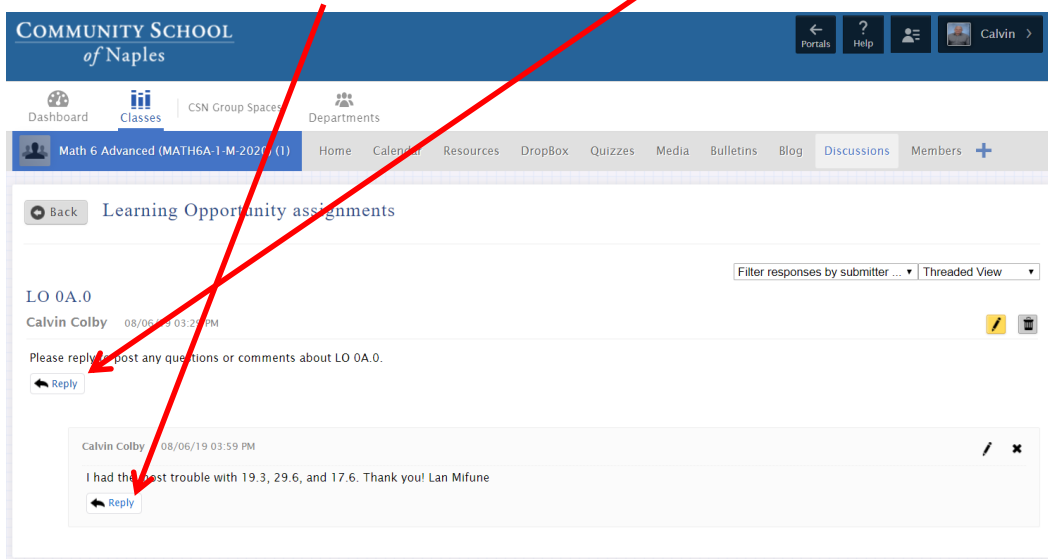

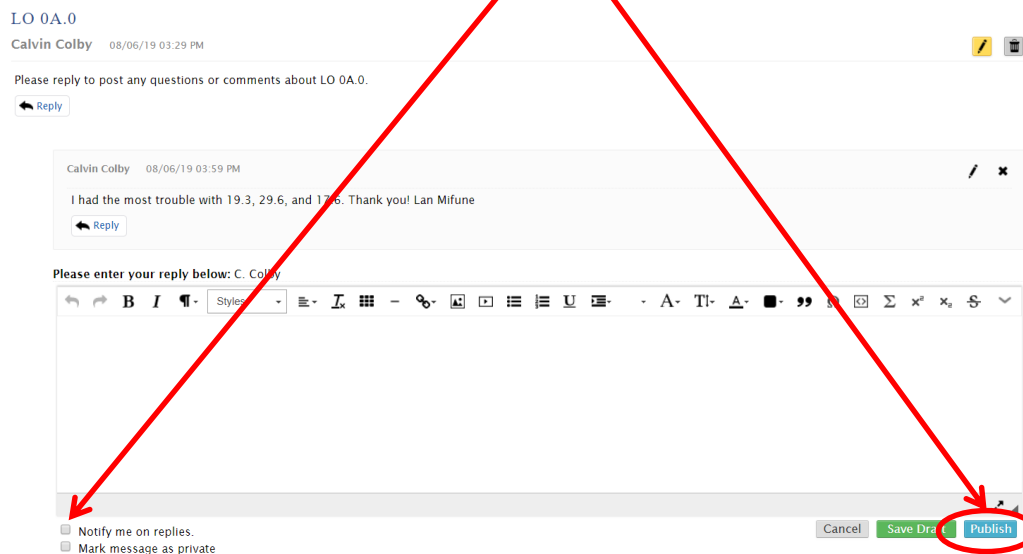

Please choose this option sparingly as your question or comment may often be helpful for other students to read, and they may also have a helpful reply to offer. Click here to publish your post.



When you enter a question or comment on a discussion board it should post immediately, and it should send the post to my email. I will most likely notice posts very quickly and respond to your questions quickly as well. However, this is not like texting. If I am driving home from school and stopping first at the grocery store, it may be a while until you get an answer to your question.
